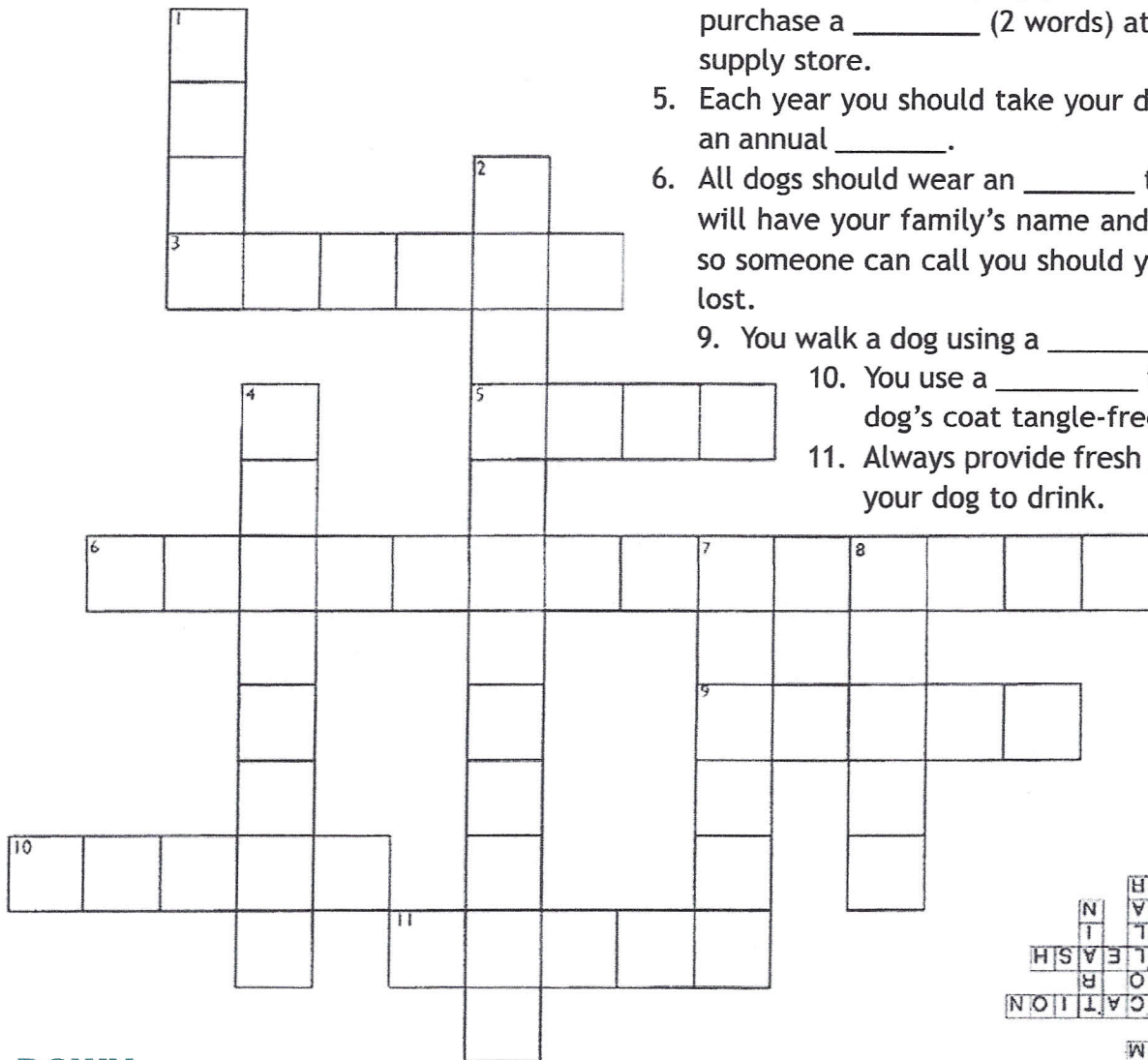
Crossword Puzzle



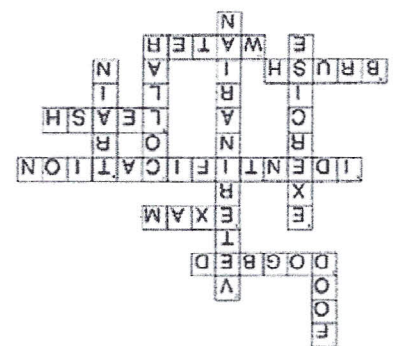

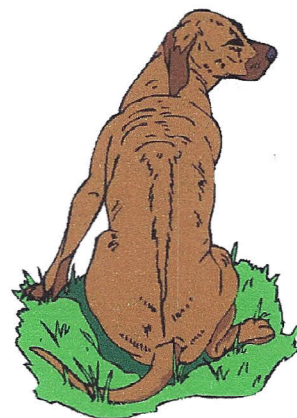

| 1. A curling tail, set high on the body, that forms a circle over the dog's back (Chow Chow)
CLUE: You may wear one of these on your finger. | GINR

| 2. A thick, tapered, blunt tail without feathering that hangs straight down (Labrador Retriever)
CLUE: Think of a small, brown animal that lives in the water. | TEROT
tail |
| 3. A bushy tail of long fringe that either hangs down or over the back (Pomeranian)
CLUE: This is another word for feather. | MEPLU
tail |
| 4. A long, fringed tail (Golden Retriever)
CLUE: Birds can also be described this way. | THEEERADF
tail |
| 5. A thick, bushy tail that resembles a fox's (Newfoundland)
CLUE: If your hair is messy, you'll need one of these. | UBRSH

| 6. A tail that has hair clipped to a round shape (Poodle)
CLUE: This word sounds like what cheerleaders use. | NOPMOP

| 7. A small curled or kinked tail (Pug)
CLUE: You may need one of these to hold something together. | WRCSE
